Boeing makes \$4M in grants to local nonprofits: Here's who's getting the funding.

The Boeing Co. (NYSE: BA) said Thursday it is donating \$4 million to 38 nonprofit organizations in the St. Louis area, with a focus on the Ferguson-Florissant, Riverview Gardens and East St. Louis areas.

The grant money, which covers the period from Sept. 1 this year through Aug. 31, 2024, emphasizes programs to advance science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) education; support veterans and military families; and provide resources for underserved communities, said Chris Bray, Boeing Global Engagement central region senior manager.

The \$4 million total includes \$1 million from Boeing's five-year, \$5 million commitment to develop a proposed advanced manufacturing center in north St. Louis, \$1.4 million in

the Ferguson-Florissant area for STEM and workforce development, about \$900,000 in the Riverview Gardens area and about \$700,000 in the East St. Louis area. The aerospace giant also provided community assistance to veterans as well as organizations focused on recidivism prevention, a Boeing spokesperson said.

Boeing in 2019 donated \$2.5 million through the regional grant partnerships program, \$3.2 million in 2020, \$4.3 million in 2021 and \$4 million in 2022, according to Bray, who has worked for Boeing for six years.

"Our goal is to be part of the journey to make St. Louis and the region the best it possibly can be," said Bray. "We can't do it alone. We have so many great philanthropic organizations out there making a difference."

It produces a number of military aircraft and weapons systems locally including the F/A-18 Super Hornet, EA-18 Growler, F-15 Eagle, eT-7A Red Hawk, MQ-25 Stingray, Joint Direct Attack Munition, Harpoon and Small Diameter Bomb. Additionally, the St. Louis Composite Center of Excellence manufactures composite parts for the Boeing 777X commercial aircraft.
